

Final Top Line Results PA Trial Lawyers' Association Fall 2005 Statewide Poll Sample Size 700 Conducted September 28 - October 3, 2005

Q1. This fall, the State General Assembly may consider a plan to double the length of time an injured worker is required to see the company's approved doctor for treatment before they can see their own doctor - from 90 days to 180 days. Would you support this change?
